- Choose to look at books and enjoys stories
- Know that information can be retrieved from books and computers
Link sounds to letters
- Hear and say initial sounds in words
- Can continue a rhyming string e.g. cat, mat, sat, bat
- Say each of the sounds in a short word
- Use a wide vocabulary influenced by an experience of books



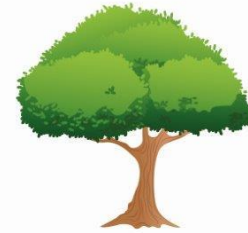
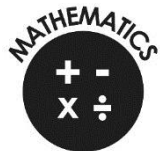
Writing

- Hold a pencil with the correct grip
- Give meaning to the marks, shapes, letters and pictures they make
- To write their name
- Know that the sounds in a word can be written down and that the letters used make up a word said
- Begin to form letters correctly and use them in emergent/independent writing



Mathematics

- Recognise numbers 1-10
- Count reliably to 10
- Count actions or objects that cannot be moved
- Count out up to 10 objects from a larger group
- Use language such as 'more' or 'fewer'
- Find one more or one less from a group of up to 10 objects
- Begin to find the total number of items in a set by counting all of them
- To name 2D shapes and begin to talk about the properties of shape
- Use positional language e.g. behind, in front, next to
- Use objects and common shapes to create and recreate patterns
