Autumn 1 - Year 1

Literacy:

This term we are looking at traditional tales such as “Goldilocks and The Three Bears”, “Little Red Riding Hood” along with many others.



The children are practising retelling a story, describing a character and describing a setting.

We would like to remind you of the importance of reading with and to your child every day.

Numeracy:

This term we will be continuing our learning about counting, shapes and colours. The children will be using the appropriate vocabulary such as “more than” or “less than”.

We will be working on our number bonds to 5, 6 and 10 . We will be working on finding 1 more and 10 more than a number, as well as 1 less and 10 less than a number.



Reading:

The children have a guided reading session with the teacher once a week, this is in small groups.

On the days the children are not reading with the teacher they will be doing reading related activities or practising reading with another adult.

All children in Year 1 will have a daily phonics session.

Topic:

Our topic for this term will be “The Jolly Postman and Friends” We will be looking at different aspects of traditional tales.

In **Science** we will be looking at the four seasons and the changes associated with each season. We will observe the weather changes and how the length of the day varies.

In **P.E** this term we are developing our co-ordination and throwing and catching skills. Year 1 have PE twice a week on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

SEAL/PSHCE: We are learning about the rules we have in school and why we have rules. We are learning the importance of keeping safe and being fair with each other.

Computing: We will be familiarising ourselves with the components of a computer such as, the keyboard and mouse, We will be practising using these while navigating on the computer.
