

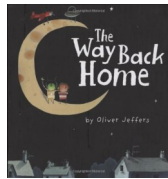


Curriculum News

Autumn 2 - Year 1

English:

Our theme this term is “Lost in Space”, we will be looking at fiction stories which take place in space or are linked to.



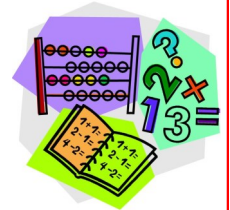
The children will be practising retelling a story, making predictions, describing a character and describing a setting.

We would like to remind you of the importance of reading with and to your child every day.

Maths:

This term we will be learning how to recognise and name 2D and 3D shapes and looking at their properties.

Our main focus will be addition and subtraction. We are learning how to use practical resources to help us. Later on this term we will start to learn how to solve word problems using addition and subtraction.



Reading:

The children have a guided reading session twice a week, this is done in small groups.

On the days the children are not reading with the teacher they will be completing reading related activities. All children in Year 1 will have a daily phonics session.



Topic:

Our topic for this term will be “Lost in Space”, we will be looking at fictional stories and learning about outer space also.

In **Science** we will be looking at the human body and the 5 senses. We will continue observing the changes which occur across the seasons.

In **P.E** this term we are developing our co-ordination and throwing and catching skills. Year 1 have PE twice a week on Mondays and Thursdays.
