<p>P.E:</p> <p>Beech Class – Wednesday and Friday (your child may come into school in their P.E. kit for Friday and then change into their school uniform after)</p> <p>Birch Class – Monday and Thursday</p> <p>P.E. kit – For P.E. your child will need:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• White George Eliot P.E. t-shirt• Green tracksuit bottoms or shorts• Socks• Black plimsolls	<p>Reading At Home:</p> <p>Your child needs to read at home for 20 minutes every day and record a short summary in their reading record.</p> <p>Children could read out loud to you or a sibling, or they may want to read silently.</p> <p>Please encourage your child and speak to us if they are having any difficulties reading at home.</p>
<p>Spelling:</p> <p>Your child will have a list of spellings that they need to learn at home. These words will be introduced in class and will follow a rule or pattern.</p> <p>Your child can practise by writing the words out, by spelling the words out loud or any other way that they find helpful.</p> <p>Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check Online: http://www.crickweb.co.uk/ks2literacy.html#looksay2</p>	<p>Times Tables:</p> <p>By the end of year 3 all children are expected to know their times tables up to 10 x 10 and the division facts. For example:</p> $4 \times 3 =$ $3 \times 4 =$ $10 \div 5 =$ $8 \div 3 =$ <p>Children need to practise at home for 10 minutes each day.
