

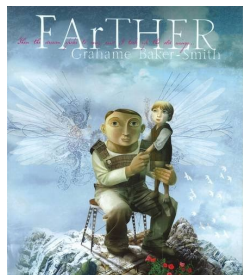


# Curriculum News

## Spring 2 - Year 3

### English:

This term we will be reading texts centred around our theme of flight. FAR<sup>T</sup>H<sup>E</sup>R and My Dad's a Birdman.



Children's writing will be focussed on creating stories with a historical setting, biographies and explanation texts.

### Maths:

This term we will be continuing our learning about place value and fractions.

We will be developing our understanding of the place value of each digit in three-digit numbers and applying that to different contexts.

We will be building on our understanding of fractions by comparing and ordering them, before adding and subtracting fractions with the same denominator.



### Reading:

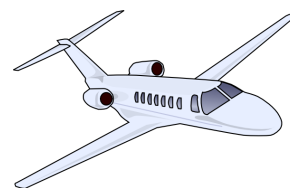
The children have a guided reading session with the teacher or teaching assistant at least twice a week.

On the days the children are not reading with the teacher they will be completing reading related activities or practising reading with another adult.

All children are expected to read **daily** with an adult at home.

### Topic:

**Our topic** for this term will be 'Eyes on The Sky'. We will be learning about notable aircraft engineers and creating our own class flying machine.
